

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus

January 25 – **World Leprosy Day**, celebrated on the last Sunday in January, around the anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi's death, is an opportunity to celebrate people who have experienced leprosy, raise awareness of the disease, and call for an end to leprosy-related stigma and discrimination. www.leprosymission.org

Jan. 25 – **The Conversion of Saint Paul, Apostle**

On his way to Damascus to persecute Christians, Saul's journey is interrupted when he sees a blinding light and communicates directly with a divine voice, after which, blind & fasting he is baptized as "Paul" and changes the course of his life as a zealous follower of Jesus.

Jan. 26 – **Saints Timothy & Titus**

Saint Timothy, Bishop, Martyr, converted by Saint Paul the Apostle, he became he trusted companion, collaborator & friend, missionary, head of the Church in Ephesus, co-author of many of the Pauline epistles and recipient of two canonical letters from Saint Paul

Saint Titus, Bishop of the church at Crete, disciple of Saint Paul the Apostle, addressed in an Epistle included in the New Testament.

Jan. 27 – **Saint Angela Merici**, Franciscan Tertiary, founder of the Institute of Saint Ursula (Ursuline Sisters)

Jan. 28 – **Saint Thomas Aquinas**, Dominican, Priest, Doctor of the Church, (Common Doctor, Angelic Doctor), philosopher and theologian, his works have been seminal to the thinking of the Church systematizing her great thoughts and teachings, and combining Greek wisdom and scholarship methods with the truth of Christianity, patron of Catholic schools and education

Jan. 31 – **Saint John Bosco (Don Bosco)**, Priest, Founder of the Salesians of Don Bosco (Salesian Society - SDB), priests who work with and educate boys, under the protection of Our Lady, Help of Christians and Saint Francis de Sales. Founded the Daughters of Mary, Help of Christians, and the Union of Cooperator Salesians.

Feb. 1 – **Saint Bridgid of Ireland**, as a child she heard Saint Patrick preach, marked by high spirits and tender heart, she could not bear to see anyone hungry or cold, and to help them, often gave away things; started convents all over Ireland, invented the double monastery; Patron of Ireland, milk maids, dairy workers, cattle, blacksmiths

The Nicene Creed Explained – Part 27

We continue our reflections on the statement:

I look forward to the life of the world to come

Before the end of time, the following events will take place in this order: the *Particular Judgement* for each person at the moment of death, the *Second Coming of Christ*, the *resurrection of the dead* and the *Last Judgement*.

We have addressed the Particular Judgement with its possible outcomes (in Parts 23 to 26), the Second Coming of Christ (in Part 7), and the resurrection of the dead (in Parts 20 to 22). In this article, we will reflect on the *Last Judgement*.

At the moment of death, each person's soul undergoes a Particular Judgement which determines his or her eternal destiny – either in Heaven or Hell. After the resurrection of the dead, when every soul will be reunited with its resurrected body, everyone will undergo another judgement, called the Last Judgement, in the presence of the entire human race.

The Last Judgement will not change the outcome from the Particular Judgement. *Why, then, do we undergo a second judgement?* We look to the Magisterium of the Catholic Church for understanding:

1) There will be no secrets after death. Everything will come to light.

At the Last Judgement, “in the presence of Christ, who is Truth itself, the truth of each man's relationship with God will be laid bare” (CCC 1039). “Then will the conduct of each one and the secrets of hearts be brought to light” (CCC 678). Every thought, remark, conversation, and intention will be revealed to all of humanity. That our every thought and word will be known to everyone at the end of time should be a sobering consideration for us to be mindful of our thoughts and speech. As Jesus tells us, “For nothing is hidden that will not be disclosed, nor is anything secret that will not become known and come to light” (Luke 8:17).

2) The consequences of all our actions will be revealed.

Our lives are lived in community with others, not in isolation. Everything we do in our life, no matter how private we think it may be, has an effect on others. At the Last Judgement, the full extent of the effects of our actions – for good or bad – will be disclosed.

The Last Judgment will reveal even to its furthest consequences the good each person has done or failed to do during his earthly life. (CCC 1039).

Like ripples created in a pool of water from a stone thrown in, our actions have far-reaching effects on the people around us and through them, the effects of our actions carry on, sometimes over generations.

At the Last Judgement, we will know to the *furthest consequences* how our actions – even private acts of prayer or sacrifice – affected the lives of others throughout history. It is comforting to know that even if we do not see the fruits of our prayers and good deeds in our lifetime, they are meritorious in God's plan of salvation for humanity, and he will reveal the effects of them on the Last Day.

Likewise, we will also see the negative impact our sins and the good that we failed to do in our lifetime had on humanity, to the *furthest reach*.

3) God's perfect justice will triumph over all of history.

At the Last Judgement, "[God the Father], through his Son Jesus Christ, will pronounce the final word on all history" (CCC 1040).

We may sometimes have trouble seeing God's presence in difficult moments. There may be situations which defy our understanding such as when we grapple with trying to make sense of evil atrocities or events that seem unfair to us or why God permits what he does. At the Last Judgement, everything will be revealed and we will see how these events played a part in the intricate tapestry of life. "We shall know the ultimate meaning of the whole work of creation and of the entire economy of salvation and understand the marvelous ways by which [God's] Providence led everything towards its final end" (CCC 1040).

Our sense of justice demands that evil actions and calamities in life somehow be rectified. "A world which has to create its own justice is a world without hope. No one and nothing can answer for centuries of suffering" (Benedict XVI *Spe Salvi*, 42). Only God can render perfect justice.

God can create justice in a way that we cannot conceive, yet we can begin to grasp it through faith.... There is justice. There is an "undoing" of past suffering, a reparation that sets things aright. For this reason, faith in the Last Judgement is first and foremost hope (Benedict XVI *Spe Salvi*, 43).

"The Last Judgment will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that God's love is stronger than death" (CCC 1040). At the end of time, God's love will triumph. Evil will be defeated. Evil will not have the last word.

On Judgment Day at the end of the world, Christ will come in glory to achieve the definitive triumph of good over evil (CCC 681).

"The message of the Last Judgment calls men to conversion while God is still giving them the acceptable time" (CCC 1041). For those striving to live in accordance with God's Commandments, "judgement, then, concerns the salvation in which we hope and which Jesus has won for us by his death and resurrection" (Francis, *Spes Non Confundit*, 22). Thus, we can look forward to Jesus' Second Coming and the Last Judgement with expectant hope, saying, "Come, Lord Jesus!" (Revelation 22:20)

In our next article, we will reflect on the new Heaven and the new Earth at the end of time.


World Marriage Day Mass for couples
