NOTICE OF MEETING OF PARISHIONERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING WARDENS

Sunday November 27, 2022, 11 am

The Council of Wardens has now set the date of Sunday, November 27, 2022 for a meeting of Parishioners for the purpose of electing Wardens. **All six positions are vacant, with two terms ending in 2023, two in 2024 and two in 2025.** Elections were not possible in 2020 and 2021 due to restrictions on meetings of large groups during the COVID-19 lockdowns.

The meeting will take place in the Parish Hall following the 10 am Sunday Mass.

What is a Warden?

The role of the Council of Wardens is defined by the Civil Code of Quebec. According to the Code, the Wardens are the administrators of the finances, material goods and property intended for the religious benefit of Parishioners.

A Warden is elected by the Parishioners at a meeting called for that purpose and must live within the Parish's geographical boundaries (Ste.-Anne-de-Bellevue, Baie d'Urfé, Senneville). The lengths of terms for the open positions are shown above. Wardens may serve a second term, if elected.

To be considered a candidate for election, you must be nominated by two Parishioners at the meeting called for that purpose.

Some of the attributes required of a Warden are:

- a sense of the Mission of Christ;
- some administrative skills;
- practical common sense.

MARY QUEEN OF APOSTLES PROVINCE



We will be holding a **second collection at all Masses next weekend, November 19- 20, 2022**. The funds collected will go to **Father Stephen's Order, the Heralds of Good News, Mary Queen of Apostles Province**, directly in support of their apostolate.

Heralds of Good News is an indigenous Clerical Missionary Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right, whose principal seat is established in the Diocese of Eluru, Andhra Pradesh, India. The Society was founded by Very Reverend Father Jose Kaimlett on October 14, 1984; it was erected as of Diocesan Right on May 5, 1991 and recognized as of Pontifical Right on May 5, 1999.

The specific aim of the Society is "training and supplying zealous and saintly, dedicated and hardworking, missionary priests wherever there is need in the Universal Church in India and abroad." These priests serve in churches that are experiencing shortage of priests due to the lack of local vocations. From its inception, the society has been sending missionaries to different countries. The Society's patrons are Mary Queen of Apostles and Saint Joseph the worker.

We will **also be collecting non-perishable food items to donate to the Christmas Basket Project at St. Willibrord's Parish** in Verdun.

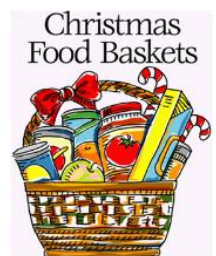
The project provides food and Christmas cheer to over 200 families in Verdun, Pointe Saint-Charles and Ville-Émard.

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

Nov. 12 – **Saint Josaphat**, Bishop, Martyr, convert

Nov. 13 – **Saint Frances Xavier Calibri**, founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, cared for poor children in schools and hospitals, in Italy and New York worked among immigrants, especially Italians, founded 67 institutions, schools, hospitals, and orphanages in the US, Europe and South America, first US citizen to be canonized

Nov. 15 – **Saint Albert the Great**, Dominican, Bishop, Doctor of the Church for his learning in natural science and theology

Nov. 16 – **Saint Margaret of Scotland**, queen, mother to 8 including Saint Maud, wife of Henry I, Saint David of Scotland and Blessed Edmund of Scotland, founded abbeys and used her position to work for justice and improved conditions for the poor

Nov. 16 – **Saint Gertrude the Great**, Benedictine Religious, Mystic, helped spread devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Nov. 17 – **Saint Elizabeth of Hungary**, princess, Religious of the Third order of Saint Francis, built a hospital at the foot of the mountain on which her castle stood and tended to the sick herself, upon the death of her husband she sold all that she had and worked to support her four children, generously gifted bread to the poor and grain to a famine-stricken Germany, Patron of bakers and related fields

Nov. 18 – **Dedication of the basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul in Rome**

persecution on a daily basis. We want to make them known, and we want to

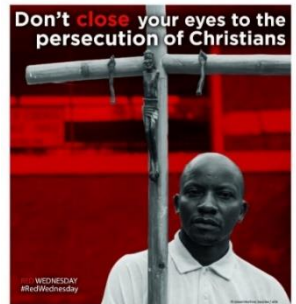
be in solidarity with them.
