## ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

Dec. 20 – **Saints Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob**, the three great Patriarchs of Judaism, whose perseverance and devotion to the one, true, God made it possible to establish the Chosen People from whom the Savior of the world would be born

Tuesday, December 21 – **WINTER SOLSTICE**

Dec. 21 – **Saint Peter Canisius**, Jesuit, Priest, Doctor of the Church, leader in the Counter-Reformation, second Apostle of Germany, wrote Catechisms

Dec. 23 – **Saint John of Kanty** (Giovanni de Ketj), Priest, professor at the University of Cracow, Patron of Poland and Lithuania

## December 17 - 23 – Daily ‘O’ Antiphons

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Christmas is now only an octave away. The ‘O’ Antiphons (also known as Greater Antiphons or the Great ‘O’) are ancient short texts chanted or recited as part of the liturgy prayed from December 17-23. They all begin with the invocation ‘O’, calling to mind the ancient longing and pleading of the people of the Old Testament for a Savior to come. They invoke a different Christological title on each of the seven days before Christmas Eve.

In praying these we remember the original yearning for the First Coming of Christ at Bethlehem, and echo the same waiting and supplication for the Emmanuel to come at Parousia, His Second Coming.

- 1) Dec. 17: **O Sapientia – ‘O Wisdom’** At God’s word, creation was formed; the Word issued from the mouth of God, the Son, came to earth; we ask prudence to keep on the paths of wisdom to come to His Kingdom.
- 2) Dec. 18: **O Adonai – ‘O Lord and Ruler’** God fulfilled His promises and redeemed the Israelites from the bondage of Egypt and unveiled the Law at Sinai; Jesus as Lord redeems mankind from the bondage of sin and bestows the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.
- 3) Dec. 19: **O Radix Jesse – ‘O Root of Jesse’** Jesse’s tree was cut down to the root, with only the stump remaining. Jesus revitalizes that root. He is the Vine and the Branches, of which requires pruning until Parousia.
- 4) Dec. 20: **O Clavis David – ‘O Key of David’** Paradise was closed by the sin of Adam, but Jesus re-opens it with His Redemption. At the end of time there will be no more sin or obstructions to the Kingdom of God.
- 5) Dec. 21: **O Oriens – ‘O Dayspring/Sun of Justice/Rising Sun’** The prophets begged for deliverance from the darkness of death, which Jesus accomplished at His resurrection as the new Rising Sun. At Parousia this Light of the World will dispel any remaining sin and darkness.
- 6) Dec. 22: **O Rex Gentium – ‘O King of Nations’** Israel in exile longed for the Kingdom of God; Jesus, Desire of Nations, extends this Kingdom to all peoples, Jews and Gentiles alike. At Parousia Jesus will draw all things to Himself and His Kingdom will be fulfilled.
- 7) Dec. 23: **O Emmanuel – ‘God with Us’** The sacred name revealed to Israel of Who was to come was fulfilled as Jesus, with His enduring presence. This is the final Scriptural image of the apocalyptic vision in Revelation, seeking the ultimate promise of the Emmanuel at Parousia: *“Surely I am coming soon. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!”* (Rev. 22:20)

These ancient antiphons echo of the longing of the faithful, reverberating and repeated through all time, “O Come, Lord Jesus!” (Rev. 22:20).

# We Hear God's Words But We Don't Really Listen to Them

Adapted from Pope Francis' address of May 31, 2013, Vatican

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today... I would like to meditate with you on [the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her kinswoman Elizabeth] this mystery which shows how Mary faced her life's journey with great realism, humanity and practicality.

Three words sum up Mary's attitude: listening, decision, action. They are words that point out a way for us too as we face what the Lord asks of us in life. Listening, decision, action.

1. Listening. What gave rise to Mary's act of going to visit her relative Elizabeth? A word of God's Angel. "Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son..." (Lk 1:36). Mary knew how to listen to God. Be careful: it was not merely "hearing", a superficial word, but it was "listening", that consists of attention, acceptance and availability to God. It was not in the distracted way with which we sometimes face the Lord or others: we hear their words, but we do not really listen. Mary is attentive to God. She listens to God.

However Mary also listens to the events, that is, she interprets the events of her life, she is attentive to reality itself and does not stop on the surface but goes to the depths to grasp its meaning.

2. The second word: decision. Mary did not live "with haste", with breathlessness, but, as St. Luke emphasizes, she "kept all these things, pondering them in her heart" (cf. Lk 2:19, 51). Moreover, at the crucial moment of the Angel's Annunciation, she also asks: "how shall this be?" (Lk 1:34). Yet she does not stop at the moment of reflection either. She goes a step further: she decides. She does not live in haste but "goes with haste" only when necessary. Mary does not let herself be dragged along by events; she does not avoid the effort of taking a decision. And this happens both in the fundamental decision that was to change her life: "I am the handmaid of the Lord..." (cf. Lk 1:38), and in her daily decisions, routine but also full of meaning. The episode of the wedding of Cana springs to my mind (cf. Jn 2:1-11): here too one sees the realism, humanity and practicality of Mary who is attentive to events, to problems.

3. The third word: action. Mary set out on a journey and "went with haste" (cf. Lk 1:39). Last Sunday I underlined Mary's way of acting: in spite of the difficulties, the criticism she would have met with because of her decision to go, nothing could stop her. And here she leaves "with haste". In prayer, before God who speaks, in thinking and meditating on the facts of her life, Mary is not in a hurry, she does not let herself be swept away by the moment, she does not let herself be dragged along by events. However, when she has clearly understood what God is asking of her, what she has to do, she does not loiter, she does not delay, but goes "with haste". St Ambrose commented: "There is nothing slow about the Holy Spirit" (Expos. Evang. sec. Lucam, II, 19: PL 15,1560). Mary's action was a consequence of her obedience to the Angel's words but was combined with charity: she went to Elizabeth to make herself useful; and in going out of her home, of herself, for love, she takes with her the most precious thing she has: Jesus. She takes her Son.

Mary, the woman of listening, of decision, of action, pray for us.
