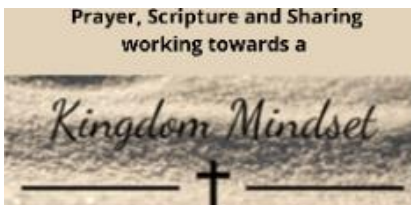

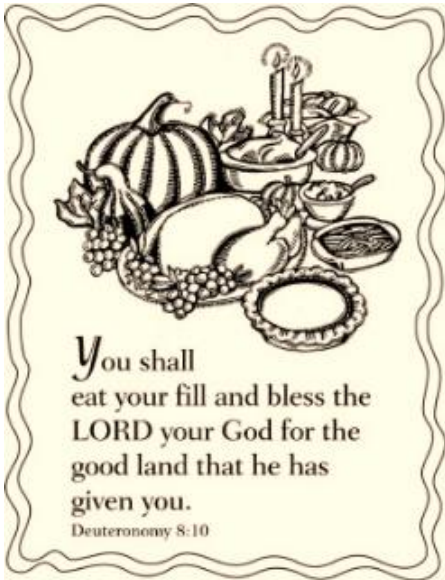
Spiritual Support for Separated or Divorced Persons

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

October is Missionary Month

Catholic faithful of Canada and all men and women of good will are invited to (re-)discover, to celebrate and to support missionary activities in the world in aid of those most in need.

Oct. 9 – **Saint Giovanni Battista Scalabrini**, Bishop of Piacenza, founder of the Congregation of the Missionaries of St. Charles Borromeo and the Congregation of the Missionary Sisters of St. Charles Borromeo (Scalabrinians) and inspirer of the Scalabrini Secular Missionaries, moved by the drama of Italians forced to emigrate, sent missionaries around the world to help and support migrants in ports, on ships and upon arrival in new countries, reconciled, considered a father to all migrants and refugees.

Oct. 9 – **Saint Denis and companions**, Martyrs, first bishop of Paris, one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers, patron of France

Oct. 9 – **Saint John Leonardi**, priest, founded the clerks Regular of the Mother of God of Lucca, the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine for the promotion of the Catholic Faith and the formation of missionaries, and a forerunner to the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples (Society for the Propagation of the Faith), worked with the sick and imprisoned, published a compendium of Christian doctrine

Oct. 9 – **Saint John Henry Newman**, Cardinal, convert from Anglicanism, founded the London Oratory, poet, influential writer on matters of theology, philosophy, and apologetics bringing hundreds into the Church, one of the great Christian intellectuals of the nineteenth century

Oct. 9 – **Our Lady of Good Help**, (Green Bay, Wisconsin, USA) The first Marian apparition approved by the Catholic Church in the United States

Oct. 10, 2022 – **THANKSGIVING DAY** (Canada)

It is a chance for people to give thanks for a good harvest and other fortunes in the past year. "It is fitting for God's people to offer public thanks for all the gifts we have received. The bountiful produce of the earth is a visible sign of the many blessings God wants to shower on us through Christ (see Eph. 1: 3-10). Our God also wants us to share the goods of the earth with all people." (ORDO 2018) Our Thanksgiving prayer ought not only express genuine thanks for all of the blessings we enjoy, but also inspire us to turn that gratitude into action by reaching out to those in need all around us.

October 10 – **World Mental Health Day** (WHO)

2022 Theme: "**Make mental health & well-being for all a global priority**"

The purpose of the day is to help expand effective global and community solutions for reversing the effects of mental illness through raising awareness, eliminating stigma, empowering communities, encouraging greater investment by key stakeholders, and celebrating accomplishments. Oct. 11 – **Saint John XXIII**, pope, launching an extensive renewal of the Church in the 20th Century, by establishing the commission for the Revision of the code of Canon Law and summoning the Second Vatican council to consider ways to renew the Church in the modern world, promote diversity within the unity of the Church, and consider reforms promoted by ecumenical and liturgical movements

Oct. 11 – **Maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary**

Oct. 12 – **Saint Wilfred of York**, Benedictine monk & priest, abbot, bishop, missionary

Oct. 12 – **Our Lady of the Pillar**, (Zaragoza, Aragon, Spain) considered the first Marian apparition, and the only recorded instance of Mary exhibiting bilocation, unique because it is the only one to have occurred while Mary was still alive on earth
