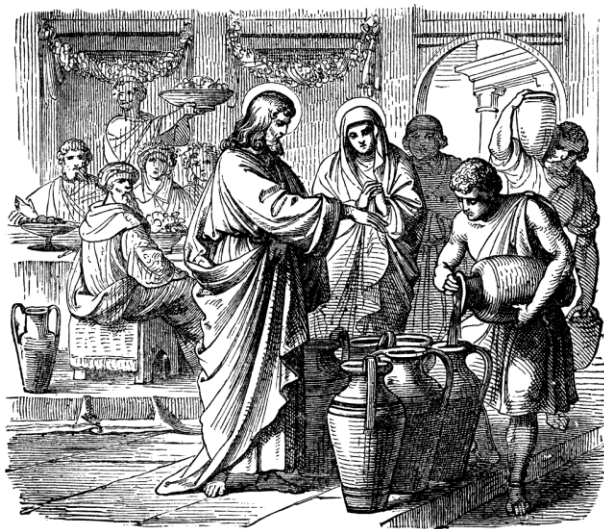

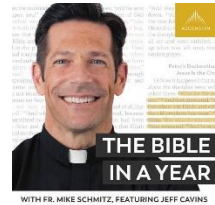

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

Sunday, January 16, 2022 – Sinulog-Santo Niño Festival

The Sinulog-Santo Niño Festival is an annual cultural and religious festival held on the third Sunday of January in Cebu City, and is the centre of the Santo Niño Catholic celebrations in the Philippines. Sinulog is the ritual prayer-dance honoring Señor Santo Niño or the Child Jesus.

Jan. 17 – **Saint Anthony of the desert**, Abbot, anchorite, hermit, miraculous healer, founded two monasteries on the Nile, his example led many to take up the monastic life, and to follow his way, Patron: against eczema, epilepsy, ergotism, erysipelas, pestilence, Saint Anthony's Fire, skin diseases and rashes, amputees, basket and brush makers, butchers, cemetery workers, domestic animals, epileptics, farmers, gravediggers, graveyards, hermits, monks, swine, swineherds, Hospitallers

Tuesday Jan. 18-25 – Week of Prayer For Christian Unity

The week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a 100-year history, beginning as an eight-day period of prayer in 1908 called the "Church Unity Octave," established by founders of the Society of the Atonement, Mother Lurana White and Servant of God Father Paul Wattson of Graymoor. Pope Pius X gave his blessing to the Church Unity Octave and in 1916, Pope Benedict XV extended its observance to the universal Church. The octave begins with the feast of the Chair of St. Peter and ends on the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. This universal week of prayer encourages Christians of all denominations to participate in various shared liturgical and community activities, and to pray together that all may be one, as Christ desires.

Jan. 20 – **Saint Fabian**, 20th Pope by acclamation, Martyr

Jan. 20 – **Saint Sebastian**, Martyr, visited Christian prisoners during the during the persecutions of Diocletian, converted soldiers and a governor to Christianity, Patron: against disease, plague, and enemies of religion, sick cattle, dying people, archers, armourers, arrowsmiths, athletes, bookbinders, fletchers, gardeners, gunsmiths, hardware stores, ironmongers, lacemakers, lead workers, masons, police officers, racquet makers, soldiers, stone masons and cutters

Jan. 21 – **Saint Agnes of Rome**, Virgin Martyr, at age 12 or 13 she chose not to accept the order to sacrifice to pagan gods or lose her virginity by rape, Patronage: bodily purity, chastity, crops, engaged couples, gardeners, Girl Scouts, girls, virgins, rape victims

Jan 22 – **Saint Vincent of Saragossa**, Deacon, Martyr during the persecutions of Diocletian
