last of 3-part series

The Holy Eucharist is the Church's greatest treasure, and all of us have a blessed responsibility to treat it as such. Here are the last of 9 suggested ways to help us in this essential duty.

- A little more about receiving Holy Communion! A few "dos" about receiving Holy Communion – do bow before receiving or kneel to receive, according to the practice of the parish and your own piety; if you are receiving in the hand, do open one palm clearly enough that the priest or minister will know where to place the Sacred Host, and do say "Amen" clearly, in a way that affirms your faith in the tremendous Mystery of which you are partaking. And a few "don'ts" – don't chew gum(!); don't allow yourself to be distracted when in line for Holy Communion; don't reach out to grab the Host from the minister; don't walk away with the Host in your hand, but consume it right there after receiving; and don't offer a response other than "Amen," as this specific word has been chosen by the Church to signify our faith and commitment to Christ.

- Spend some time giving thanks to God. You may have heard that the very word "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving," and that is the attitude that should fill our hearts after receiving Holy Communion. God has just given us a Gift beyond comprehension, and we ought to thank Him profusely for all He has done for us. We do this by joining in any Communion song being sung during Holy Communion, but also by spending some time in silence offering God our heartfelt thanks for saving us, strengthening us, being with us, and drawing us closer to Himself.

There is a beautiful scene in the movie *The Passion of the Christ*, after Jesus is scourged at the pillar, when the Blessed Virgin Mary and Mary Magdalene devoutly use towels to take up Christ's Blood from the ground around the pillar. Their reverence for the Blood of Christ gives us a great image for our own treatment of the Holy Eucharist, what I have called in this article our "hosting" of Jesus present among us in the Sacrament of the Altar.

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

Sept. 17 – **Saint Hildegard of Bingen**, Benedictine abbess, Doctor of the Church, writer, philosopher, Christian mystic and visionary, composer of sacred monophony, that is songs with a single tune or melody, usually performed by a single voice or instrument

Sept. 17 – **Saint Robert Bellarmine**, Jesuit, Bishop, Doctor of the Church, preacher and theologian, defended doctrine under attack during and after the Reformation; wrote two catechisms; took a fundamentally democratic position with regard to power: authority originates with God, is vested in the people, who entrust it to fit rulers, a concept which brought him trouble with the kings of both England and France; Patron of catechists and catechumens

Sept. 18 – **Saint Stanislaw Kostka**, Jesuit, friend of Saint Peter Canisius, Patron for healing broken bones, last sacraments, Poland

Sept. 19 – **Saint Januarius of Naples**, Bishop, Martyr, his blood was preserved and dried; since at least 1389, the blood liquefies on his feast day, and on the Saturday before the first Sunday in May

Sept. 20 – **Saint Andrew Kim and Company** (Saints Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Priest, Paul Chong Ha-sang and Companions), Martyrs of Korea

Sept. 21 – **Saint Matthew**, Roman tax collector (a position equated with collaboration with the enemy by those from whom he collected taxes), Apostle, Evangelist, Matthew's Gospel is given pride of place in the canon of the New Testament, and was written to convince Jewish readers that their anticipated Messiah had come in the person of Jesus. Apostle to Ethiopia: he preached among the Jews for 15 years and his audiences may have included the Jewish enclave in Ethiopia, and places in the East

Sept. 21 – **International Day of Peace/ World Peace Day** (UN)

Dedicated to world peace, and specifically the absence of war and violence. The Peace Bell is rung at UN Headquarters (New York City).

Sept 21, 23 & 24 – **Autumn Ember Days/ Fall Embertide**

Ember days begin the new season ordered as days of fast and abstinence, prayer and penance. We thank God for the gifts of nature and are reminded to make use of these in moderation, and to assist the needy. We offer prayers of public thanksgiving and for the needs of all people, for the productivity of the earth and for human labour. The prayers of Fall Embertide are especially for holy obedient orthodox priests as fruitful labourers in the fields of the Lord.

Sept. 22 – **FALL EQUINOX**

Sept. 23 – **Saint Padre Pio** (Pius of Pietrelcina), Capuchin, priest, stigmatist, confessor reportedly able to read the consciences of those who held back, able to bilocate, levitate, and heal by touch, Founded the House for the Relief of Suffering Hospital, started a series of prayer groups that continue today

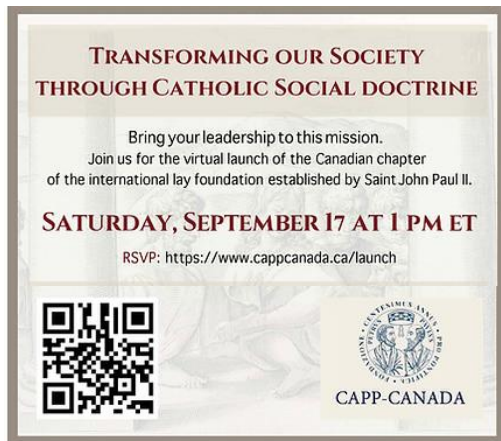

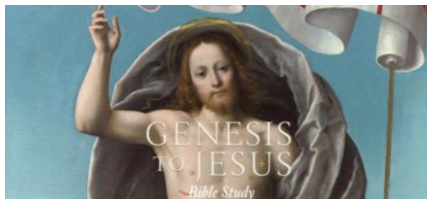
