ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus**Jan. 18 – SANTO NIÑO CELEBRATIONS – SINULOG FESTIVAL**

Sinulog is an annual cultural and religious Filipino festival. On March 16, 1521, the Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan planted the cross on the shores of Cebu, claiming the territory for Spain. He presented the image of the Child Jesus, *Señor Santo Niño*, to the indigenous rulers, who promptly danced with joy and converted. Along with the rulers of the island, some 800 natives were also baptized to the Roman Catholic Church. Sinulog is a ritual prayer-dance and the word describes the 2-steps-forward-1-step-back movement of the dance. Pilgrims make a yearly journey to take part in the procession and festival.

January 18-25: WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The week of Prayer for Christian Unity encourages Christians of all denominations around the world to meet, reflect on scripture together, participate in jointly-organized ecumenical services or other liturgical and community activities, to pray together that all may be one, as Christ desires, and to share fellowship.

Jan. 20 – **Saint Sebastian**, Martyr, he visited martyrs in prison, bringing supplies and comfort, converted soldiers and a governor to Christianity, charged as a Christian, Sebastian was tied to a tree, shot with arrows, and left for dead but survived, recovered and returned to preach, in the end he was beaten to death – Patron: against disease, plague and enemies of religion, sick cattle, dying people, archers, armourers, arrow smiths, athletes, bookbinders, fletchers, gardeners, gunsmiths, hardware stores, ironmongers, lace makers, lace workers, lead-workers, masons, police officers, racquet makers, soldiers, stone masons, stonemasons

Jan. 21 – **Saint Agnes of Rome**, Virgin Martyr, ordered at age 12 or 13 to sacrifice to pagan gods and lose her virginity by rape, she was taken to a Roman temple to Minerva where she made the Sign of the Cross when led to the altar for which she was threatened then tortured to death when she refused to turn against God – Patron: bodily purity, chastity, crops, engaged couples, gardeners, Girl Scouts, girls, rape victims, virgins

Jan. 24 – **Saint Francis de Sales**, Bishop of Geneva, Doctor of the Church for Charity, co-founder of the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary (Visitandines), known for his writings on spiritual direction and spiritual formation “pointing out to souls an easy and safe way to arrive at the perfection of a Christian life.” Patron of writers and journalists, and of the deaf

The Nicene Creed Explained – Part 26

We continue our reflections on the statement:

I look forward to the life of the world to come

As we noted in Part 23, there are only two outcomes from the *Particular Judgement*: eternity in either *Heaven* or *Hell*. We reflected on what *Heaven* is in Part 24. In this article, we will reflect on what the state of *Hell* is.

“We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love him. But we cannot love God if we sin gravely against him, against our neighbor or against ourselves” (CCC 1033). “Grave sin, [mortal sin], deprives us of communion with God and therefore makes us incapable of eternal life” (CCC 1472).

When we commit mortal sins, by our own free will we are separating ourselves from God. “Unrepented, it brings eternal death” (CCC 1874). “One who desires to obtain reconciliation with God and with the Church, must confess to a priest all the unconfessed grave sins he remembers” (CCC 493).

To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from him for ever by our own free choice. This state of definitive *self-exclusion* from communion with God and the blessed is called “hell” (CCC 1033).

God “desires all men to be saved” (1 Timothy 2:4), “for God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life” (John 3: 16). God does not send anyone to Hell. “It is the human person who *freely excludes* himself from communion with God if at the moment of death he persists in mortal sin and refuses the merciful love of God.” (Compendium of the Catholic Church 213)

Jesus' words are clear in the parable of the sheep and the goats (Matthew 25: 31-46) that a soul separated from God after death will have to endure an eternity of suffering: “Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire” (Matthew 25: 41). “The chief punishment of hell is eternal separation from God, in whom alone man can possess the life and happiness for which he was created and for which he longs.” (CCC 1035)

Although “the teaching of the Church affirms the existence of hell and its eternity” (CCC 1035), the Church does not declare who or how many are in Hell. “We must entrust judgement of persons to the justice and mercy of God” (CCC 1861).

Nevertheless, we must be cognisant that Hell is a permanent state of isolation from God and the Communion of Saints, with *no opportunity for repentance or a second chance*. This reality should imprint upon us the gravity of mortal sin.

The affirmations of Sacred Scripture and the teachings of the Church on the subject of hell are a call to the responsibility incumbent upon man to make use of his freedom in view of his eternal destiny. They are at the same time an urgent call to conversion (CCC 1036).

“Christ’s call to conversion [is not only for the unbaptized but] continues to resound in the lives of Christians” (CCC 1428). We are each called to a deeper conversion *everyday*, to take up our cross daily and follow Christ (Luke 9:23) in our path towards holiness, “to be perfect as [our] heavenly Father is perfect” (Matthew 5:48)

Since “our freedom has the power to make choices for ever, with no turning back” (CCC 1861), the stakes are high – eternity with God or without him. “The Church prays that no one should be lost” (CCC 1058). May we persevere in prayer, charity and sacrifices, not only for our own salvation, but also for our loved ones and the whole world.

“It is never too late to touch the heart of another, nor is it ever in vain.... Our hope is always essentially also hope for others....

As Christians we should never limit ourselves to asking: how can I save myself? We should also ask: what can I do in order that others may be saved and that for them too the star of hope may rise? (Benedict XVI, *Spe Salvi*, 48).

“The Lord is not slow about his promise [of his Second Coming], as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance.”
(2 Peter 3: 9)

The Archdiocese of Montreal continues its commitment to fostering healthy, safe, and accountable parish environments by offering Focus on Victims of Abuse formation sessions this winter. The training is **offered to parish volunteers, churchwardens, catechists, and parish staff**, and is designed to deepen awareness of the impact of abuse, encourage sustained vigilance, and strengthen a culture of prevention, responsibility, and attentive listening at the heart of our Christian communities.
