JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – 2025

We continue to examine the Papal Bull “*Spes Non Confundit*”

*“Hope does not disappoint
because God’s love has been poured into our hearts
through the Holy Spirit” –Romans 5:5*



A Papal (or Pontifical) “Bull of Indiction” is an official document, usually written in Latin, published by the Pope to proclaim a Jubilee Year.

The Papal Bull for this Jubilee Year of Hope, translated into English, can be found here:

It is worthwhile reading this document to reflect on the Holy Father’s theme of hope for this year.

Each week, we will select a few sentences from each paragraph in the Bull as inspirational reflections to help us live this Jubilee Year of Hope.

Excerpts from Paragraph 2:

- *Hope does not disappoint, because God’s love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.*
- *The Church of Rome was not founded by Paul, yet he felt impelled to hasten there in order to bring to everyone the Gospel of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen from the dead, a message of hope that fulfils the ancient promises, leads to glory and, grounded in love, does not disappoint.*

The Nicene Creed

Together, as pilgrims of hope, we continue to explore the Nicene Creed.

Statements in the Nicene Creed explained – part 1

There are four sections of the Nicene Creed, each dealing with one of the major dogmas of our faith:

- 1) God the Father;
- 2) God the Son;
- 3) God the Holy Spirit, and;
- 4) God's Holy Church.

A DOGMA is an essential and unchanging truth of the Catholic faith proclaimed by the Church to be divinely revealed, and must be believed by all Catholics.

The Creed begins with:

*I believe in one God,
the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all things visible and invisible.*

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC) says, "Our profession of faith begins with God, for God is the First and the Last, the beginning and the end of everything. The Credo begins with God, the *Father*, for the Father is the first divine person of the Most Holy Trinity; our Creed begins with the creation of heaven and earth, for creation is the beginning and the foundation of all God's works." (CCC 198).

We believe in one God in three Persons. We do not believe in three Gods. God reveals Himself to us as "Father", and so we are His children. He invites us to have a personal relationship with Him.

Our belief in a God who is Almighty means that God is omnipotent (all-powerful), omniscient (all-knowing) and omnipresent (present in all places at all times).

As we read in the *Catechism*, "God has no other reason for creating than his love and goodness: 'Creatures came into existence when the key of love opened his hand.' " (CCC 293, quoting Saint Thomas Aquinas).

God the Father creates everything from nothing – everything that we can see (such as the earth, stars, trees, everything around us) as well as all things that we cannot see (such as Heaven, angels, our souls and everything in the spiritual realm).

"Statements in the Nicene Creed explained" continues next week.

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

April is dedicated to the Holy Eucharist

April 12 – PESACH / PASSOVER – The Seder feast is held on the first two nights of Passover (just the first night in Israel), after nightfall. These are full-fledged, no-work-allowed holiday days.

April 13 – Sainte Margaret of Cast Castello; Third Order Dominican, born blind, lame, deformed, hunchback and a midget, abandoned, Patron of the poor and impoverished, disabled and handicapped people, anyone dealing with a disability or physical challenge, people rejected by religious orders, Right-to-Life movement

April 16 – Saint Benoit (Benedict) Labre, perpetual pilgrim for Christ spending his life in continual prayer and sacrifice who made the whole world his monastery, embarking on a life of pilgrimages which would lead him to the principal shrines of Europe, as a wayfarer living off alms, Patron of: beggars, hoboes and tramps, homeless people, mentally ill people, people rejected by religious orders, pilgrims, unmarried men

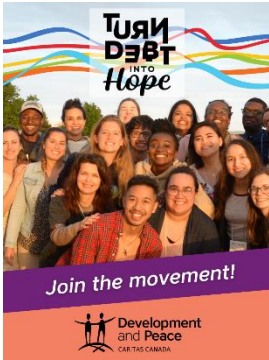
April 17 - Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, known for spirituality and austere lifestyle, miracle worker, her grave became a pilgrimage site and place of miracles for Christian Native Americans and French colonists, first Native American proposed for canonization, known as Lily of the Mohawks, patroness of Canada and Native Americans, a saint for those persecuted for piety

April 18 – Blessed Marie-Anne Blondin, religious, foundress of the Sisters of Sainte Anne, a teaching order, a religious congregation "for the education of poor country children, both girls and boys in the same schools"
