

## ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

Sept. 24 – **Blessed Émilie Tavernier-Gamelin**, widow, mother, Religious, founded the Sisters of Providence

Sept. 25 – **Saints Cosmas and Damian**, twins, Martyrs, as physicians they accepted no payment for their services and their charity brought many to Christ

Sept. 25 – **WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES**

“**Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees**” is the theme of the 2022 World Day of Migrants and Refugees, chosen by Pope Francis to highlight the commitment that we are all called to share in building a future that embraces God’s plan, leaving no one behind. “The phenomenon of migration today is a providential opportunity for the proclamation of the Gospel in the contemporary world. Men and women from various regions of the earth who have not yet encountered Jesus Christ or know him only partially, ask to be received in countries with an ancient Christian tradition. It is necessary to find adequate ways for them to meet and to become acquainted with Jesus Christ and to experience the invaluable gift of salvation.” (Pope Benedict XVI, 2012)

Sept. 26 – **Saints Jean de Brébeuf, Issac Jogues Priests and their Companions, Jesuit Martyrs of North America**, also known as the Martyrs of New France, Canadian Martyrs, North American Martyrs, this group included lay brothers: Antoine Daniel, Charles Garnier, Gabriel Lalemant, Jean de la Lande, Noel Chabanel, Rene Goupil, sent as missionaries in the area of modern Quebec, Ontario and New York, whose deaths proved to be “one of the triumphant failures that are commonplace in the Church’s history” by creating a wave of vocations and missionary fervor in France, and giving new heart to the missionaries in New France; Secondary Patrons of Canada

Sept. 27 – **Saint Vincent de Paul**, Franciscan, Priest, worked always for the poor, the enslaved, the abandoned, the ignored, the pariahs; founded the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity, instituted the Congregation of Priests of the Mission (Lazarists); Patron of charitable societies

Sept. 27 – **WORLD TOURISM DAY (UN)** It is essential to examine tourism’s actual and potential contribution to sustainable development. The Church is concerned about tourism in the world, remembering the words of Jesus to his disciples, “*Whatever house you enter, first say, ‘Peace to this house!’ And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person.*” (Luke 10: 5-6)

Sept. 28 – **Saint Wenceslaus (Waclaw)**, Martyr, Duke of Bohemia, fought against pagan backlash against Christianity with prayer and patience, murdered but listed as a martyr since the politics arose from his faith; subject of the Christmas carol Good King Wenceslas; Patron of Bohemia, the Czech Republic, Moravia

Sept. 28 – **Saint Lorenzo (Lawrence) Ruiz and Companions**, Martyred in Japan, married, father, member of the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary and a group of 15 people (including: two consecrated women; a layman named Saint Lazaro of Kyoto, a leper; and, another layman; two brothers; and, nine priests including three Dominican priests, Antonio Gonzalez, Guillermo Courtet, and Miguel de Aozaraza, a Japanese priest, Vicente Shiwozuka de la Cruz), Lorenzo was the 1st Filipino canonized saint

## Saint 29 – Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels [Michaelmas]

- Michael (Who is like God?) was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God.
- Gabriel (Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people.
- Raphael (Medicine of God) is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.

Sept. 30 – **Saint Jerome**, monk, priest, Doctor and Father of the Church, one of the four original Doctors of the Latin Church, revised the Latin text of the Bible and the result of his 30 years of work is the standard Latin version known as the *Vulgate* translation which is still in use today
