

NOTICE OF MEETING OF PARISHIONERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING WARDENS

Sunday November 27, 2022, 11 am

The Council of Wardens has now set the date of Sunday, November 27, 2022 for a meeting of Parishioners for the purpose of electing Wardens. **All six positions are vacant, with two terms ending in 2023, two in 2024 and two in 2025.** Elections were not possible in 2020 and 2021 due to restrictions on meetings of large groups during the COVID-19 lockdowns. (Clarification concerning the vacancies is on the following page.)

The meeting will take place in the Parish Hall following the 10 am Sunday Mass.

What is a Warden?

The role of the Council of Wardens is defined by the Civil Code of Quebec. According to the Code, the Wardens are the administrators of the finances, material goods and property intended for the religious benefit of Parishioners.

A Warden is elected by the Parishioners at a meeting called for that purpose and must live within the Parish's geographical boundaries (Ste.-Anne-de-Bellevue, Baie d'Urfé, Senneville). The lengths of terms for the open positions are shown above. Wardens may serve a second term, if elected.

To be considered a candidate for election, you must be nominated by two Parishioners at the meeting called for that purpose.

Some of the attributes required of a Warden are:

- a sense of the Mission of Christ;
- some administrative skills;
- practical common sense.

NOTE OF CLARIFICATION CONCERNING THE VACANCIES ON THE FABRIQUE – COUNCIL OF WARDENS *

As this is the first occasion on which the Parish could hold an election since the COVID lockdowns began in March 2020, a few words of clarification on the vacant positions on the Council of Wardens may be appropriate. During that period the terms of office of three Wardens in office expired but they continued to carry out their functions as prescribed by the law. The terms of two more Wardens will expire at the end of December 2022. One position was vacant. That is why all six Wardens' positions are up for election on November 27.

Going into the lockdown period, the Council of Wardens consisted of:

- The Chairman: Wally Rowcliffe, appointed by the Archbishop until December, 2024;
- The Pastor, Fr. Stephen: ex-officio, a member of the Fabrique;
- Five Wardens: Hank Bourdeau, Donal Irving, Josiah Farrow, Anne Parsons, Shelby Hacala;
- One vacant position of Warden.

According to the law, Wardens are permitted two consecutive terms in office. Only two of the five Wardens in office during the lockdown period have served one term and are, therefore, eligible for election to a second term: Anne Parsons and Shelby Hacala. They have indicated their willingness to be nominated. In addition, at the time of this writing, four other parishioners have graciously indicated their willingness to run for the office.

At the conclusion of the election on November 27, therefore, it is anticipated that the Council of Wardens will consist of the Chairman, Wally, the Pastor, Fr. Stephen, and a full complement of six Wardens.

Please plan to be there and show your support for the Council of Wardens.

* The activities of the Fabrique of Corpus Christi Parish are governed by the Fabrique Act, a statute of the Civil Code of Quebec.


CHRISTMAS BASKETS FOOD DRIVE

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

Nov. 20 – **Saint Felix of Valois** Cistercian monk at Clairvaux, hermit, priest, co-founded the Order of the Holy Trinity for the Redemption of Captives (Trinitarians; Redemptionists) in order to ransom Christians held as slaves by Moors in Spain and Northern Africa, today there are around 600 members of the Order working in prison ministries in over twenty countries

Nov. 21 – **Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, recognizing Mary as a temple where God lies

Nov. 22 — **Saint Cecilia**, Martyr, patron of music, musicians & singers

Nov. 23 – **Saint Clement I**, Apostolic Father, fourth Pope, Martyr, convert, one of the Seventy Apostles mentioned in Philippians 4:3

Nov. 23 – **Saint Columban**, Abbot, missionary, led twelve companions to carrying Celtic Christianity throughout Europe when paganism threatened to extinguish the faith, from Ireland through Scotland, England, and then to France, Patron of motorcyclists

Nov. 24– **Saint Andrew Anrê Tran An Dúng-Lac and companions**, , priest and laypeople, Martyrs of Vietnam

Nov. 25 – **Saint Catherine of Alexandria**, Martyr, one of the Fourteen Holy helpers, convert, martyr, Patron of libraries, librarians, teachers, archivists, lawyers, maidens, apologists, philosophers, craftsmen who work with a wheel (potters, spinners, wheelwrights, etc.)

November 29 – **GIVING TUESDAY**

Celebrated to help the “giving season” get started, it reminds people that there is more to holidays than consumerism and commercialization. It is a movement for giving and volunteering, where charities, companies and individuals join together to share commitments, rally for favorite causes and think about others.


