## A Baking Tradition for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception

The special treat for this feast is Moravian Spritz or gingerbread cookies, loaded with fine, aromatic spices. These are mixed on the vigil of the feast, December 7, then baked on this day because they remind us of the passage in the Book of Sirach that describes Mary smelling like spices:

I gave a sweet smell like cinnamon and aromatical balm; I yielded a sweet odor like the best myrrh; and I perfumed my dwelling as store, and galbanum, and onyx, and aloes, and as the frankincense not cut, and my odor is as the purest balm. (Sirach, formerly Ecclesiasticus 24: 20-21)

This type of cookie fills the air with spicy odors, like the quoted passage speaks of Mary.

# ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

Dec. 4 – **Saint John Damascene**, Priest, Doctor of the Church for Christian Art, last of the Greek Fathers of the Church and the first of the Christian Aristotleans, defended the use of icons, writer of poetry and hymns, defended the orthodox faith, commentator, such an excellent speaker that he was known as *Chrysorrhoas* ("golden-stream")

Dec. 6 – **Saint Nicholas of Myra**, Bishop, Generous to the poor, and special protector of the innocent and wronged, many stories grew up around him prior to his becoming associated with Santa Claus.

Dec. 7 – Saint Ambrose of Milan, Bishop of Milan, Honey-tongued Doctor of the Church bestowed because of his speaking and preaching ability, Father of the church, one of the four original Doctors of the Latin Church (Ambrose, Augustine, Jerome, and Pope Gregory I),

Dec. 8 – IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, the solemn dogma that the "most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin." (Catechism of the Catholic Church) Principal patron of the Ecclesiastical province of Montréal

Dec. 9 – **Saint Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin**, chosen to receive the Guadalupe apparition of Mary at Tepeyac, Mexico, where Our Lady asked him to tell his Bishop that she desired a shrine to be built on the spot to manifest her love for all mankind and she left a marvelous portrait of herself on his mantle as a sign for the Bishop which survives to this day

Dec. 10 – **Our Lady of Loreto**, the Shrine of the Holy House at Loreto, by tradition considered the house in which Mary was born and where the Annunciation occurred, and the ancient statue of Our Lady which is found there, the first shrine of international renown dedicated to the Blessed Virgin

Dec. 10 - **Saint Melchiades**, Pope, Martyr, ruled the Church of God in the last period of the Christian persecution under Maximianus, had the good fortune of witnessing the beginning of an era of peace

Dec. 11 – **Saint Damasus I**, 37th Pope, commissioned the Latin Vulgate translation of the Bible by Saint Jerome, devoted to finding the tombs of martyrs which had been both blocked up and hidden during previous persecutions, lighting the passages and stairwells of the catacombs, encouraged pilgrimages to the martyrs, beautified existing churches, vigorous defender of orthodoxy condemning the heresies of Macedonius and Apollinaris and the Eastern Arians

# Monday, December 6 – National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women

The Church in solidarity against violence against women On December 6, we are painfully reminded of the assassination of 14 young women at the Ecole Polytechnique of Montreal, in 1989. The Social Action Office invites you to wear a white ribbon symbolizing solidarity with the eradication of Violence against Women.

Last month, the CCCB Commission for Justice and Peace released a Pastoral Letter entitled For Freedom Christ has Set us Free: Pastoral Letter on Human Trafficking and Sexual Exploitation in Canada,

drawing attention to the inherently exploitative and abusive nature of the purchase of sex and insisting that in order to protect the vulnerable, this practice must continue to be criminalized: "Treating sex as 'work' masks the physical, psychological and sexual violence inflicted on the prostituted person." <u>https://www.cccb.ca/wp-content/uploads/2021/11/CCCB-Human-Trafficking-Pastoral-Letter-2021.pdf</u>
