

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

April 11 – **Saint Stanislaus of Cracow**, Bishop, Martyr, symbol of Polish patriotism and nationalism, Patron of Cracow and Poland

April 13 – **Saint Martin I**, Pope, the last martyred pope.

April 13 – **Saint Margaret of Cast Castello**, born blind, lame, deformed, hunchback. Abandoned by her noble parents, she became a third-order lay Dominican and spent her life in prayer and charity. When she died, the townspeople thronged her funeral, and demanded she be buried in a tomb inside the church. The priest protested, but when a crippled girl was miraculously cured at the funeral, he finally consented. Patron of the poor and impoverished, disabled and handicapped people, anyone dealing with a disability or physical challenge, people rejected by religious orders, Right-to-Life movement

GOOD FRIDAY IS A DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE.

The faithful aged 18-60, in good health, are asked to limit food and drink (typically to one main meal and two smaller meals with no solid food in between) and abstain from meat in order to be more attentive in prayer.

PASCHAL FAST

Good Friday and Holy Saturday are days of prayer and quiet reflection.

We honour the suffering and death of Jesus

and prepare to share in the resurrection at Easter.

PALM SUNDAY

At Mass on Palm Sunday, we re-enact with our procession with palms, the welcome of Jesus in his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, as a public display of homage and loyalty to Christ our King and Redeemer.

Since Palm branches aren't readily available in some areas, there are other plants like olive branches, box, yew, spruce, willows and pussy-willows that may be blessed and used the same way for Passion Sunday.

Palm Sunday is also known as "Fig Sunday" due to the tradition that Christ ate figs after his entry into Jerusalem. As related in Saint Matthew's Gospel shortly after the account of the triumphant entry into Jerusalem, with the withering of the barren fig tree.

Blessed Palms in Your Home – Reverence for Sacramentals

Christ is the King of our home, so we bring blessed palms are kept in the home as a witness to faith in Jesus Christ, the messianic king, and in his Paschal Victory." Because the palms are blessed, they are now sacramentals, which "are sacred signs instituted by the Church. They prepare [us] to receive the fruit of the sacraments and sanctify different circumstances of life." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1667) Sacramentals should be treated with respect and not simply be thrown away – your palms should only be burned or buried after display, so you may return them to church to be burnt for Ash Wednesday nest year.
