Invite them to register for faith formation at Corpus Christi. Spread the word! Many of the families in our program have come through the personal invitation from someone in the parish.



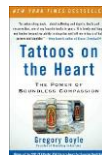
FAITH FORMATION – Adults (RCIA)

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

AUGUST is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

August 1 – **Saint Alphonsus Maria de Liguori**, (1696-1787) Bishop, Doctor “*Zelantissimus*” (Most Zealous Doctor), Moral theologian, founder of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Liguorians, Redemptorists), gifted musician and composer, prolific writer about, Patron of confessors, vocations, moral theologians, and those who suffer from arthritis and rheumatism

August 2 – **Saint Pierre-Julien Eymard**, (1811-1868; France), Priest, mystic, founder of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament and the lay Servants of the Blessed Sacrament, Apostle of the Eucharist, pioneer in the rediscovery of the importance of the bread of life and the active involvement of laypersons in the life of the Church

August 4 – **Saint Jean-Baptiste Marie Vianney**, (1786-1859; France), Priest/Curé of Ars-en-Dombes, renowned confessor, patron of parish priests, He visited his parishioners, especially the sick and poor, spent days in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, did penance for his parishioners, and lead his people by example, had the gifts of discernment of spirits, prophecy, hidden knowledge, and of working miracles.

August 5 – **Blessed Frédéric Janssoone**, (1838-1916; France & Montreal), Franciscan, rebuilt the Stations of the Cross in the streets of Jerusalem and a church in Bethlehem, negotiated agreements between church authorities about the use of sanctuaries in Jerusalem, helped develop the Sanctuary of Our Lady of the Rosary (Notre-Dame-du-Cap) near Trois-Rivières

August 6 – **THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD**, Jesus he becomes radiant in glory upon a mountain in sight of three of his disciples, Peter, James, and John; this is the second of two theophanies in the New Testament (after the Baptism of Our Lord), showing the divinity of Christ and marking the explicit presence of all 3 persons of the Blessed Trinity.

August 6 & 9 – *the cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki were ravaged by atomic bombs.*)

August 7 – **Saint Cajetan**, (1480-1547; Italy), Priest, member of the confraternity of the Roman Order of Divine Love founded the Congregation of Clerks Regular (Theatines); Patron of job seekers and unemployed people

August 8 – **Saint Dominic de Guzman**, (1170-1221; Italy), Priest, founded the Order of Friars Preachers (Dominicans), spread devotion to the use of the rosary to strengthen people's spiritual life esp. against the heresy of the Cathars; Patron of the Dominican Republic, astronomers, scientists and the falsely accused

August 9 – **Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein)**, (1891-1942; Germany), Carmelite, Religious, Martyr, Co-Patron of Europe

August 10 – **Saint Lawrence of Rome**, (c. 225 - 258) Martyr, Deacon in charge of giving help to the poor and the needy; Patron of comedians, cooks, paupers, poor people, archivists, librarians, school children

August 11 – **Saint Clare of Assisi**, (1194-1253; Italy), friend of Saint Frances of Assisi, founder of the Order of Poor Ladies (Poor Clares); Patron of television & communications

August 12 – **Sainte Jeanne de Chantal**, (1572-1641; France), wife and mother, friend of Saint Frances de Sales, founder of the Congregation of the Visitation of Our Lady (Visitationists); Patron of abandoned or forgotten people, against abandonment, against in-law problems, against the death of parents, parents separated from children, widows

August 13 – **Saints Hippolytus and Pontian**, (- c. 235; Rome) priest and Pope, Martyrs Hippolytus the most important theologian and prolific religious writer before the age of Constantine, the fullest source of our knowledge of the Roman liturgy and the structure of the Church in the second and third centuries.

Pontian ended the schism of Hippolytus and reconciled the schismatics with the Church, exiled with Saint Hippolytus to Sardinia and sentenced to work in the mines.

August 13 – **Blessed Michael Joseph McGivney**, (1852- 1890, Connecticut), priest, founded the Knights of Columbus

August 14 – **Saint Maximilian Kolbe**, (1894-1941; Poland), Conventual Franciscan, Priest, Martyr, apostle of consecration to Mary
