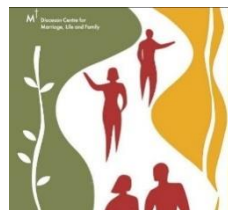
Widow and Widower Support Group – New Meeting time

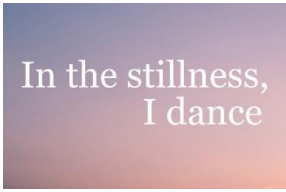

About Carlo Acutis

Carlo Acutis was beatified in 2020, having died of leukemia at the age of 15. Showing remarkable courage and great faith during the course of his illness, he felt profoundly drawn to the Eucharistic miracles. He loved video games, football and working on computers, but his greatest attraction was to Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. In 2002, he began his project of creating an exhibition to feature the most important of the Eucharistic miracles that had occurred on five continents. The project, which also came to involve his family members, took two and a half years to accomplish. With this Exhibition, the young Blessed Carlo's intention was to bring attention to the power of the Eucharist and to Jesus' real presence in it. This Exhibition is touring the world.

The month of May is dedicated to The Blessed Virgin Mary.

A Time of Grace (excerpted and adapted from www.catholicculture.com)

The world is resplendent with Spring's increased light and new growth. It is Mary's month in the Easter season and all of nature rejoices with the Queen of heaven at the Resurrection of the Son she was worthy to bear. During the remainder of Easter time, let us endeavor through the prayers of the Holy Liturgy and the Holy Rosary to deepen our gratitude for the mystery of our Baptismal rebirth in Christ.

"The month of May, with its profusion of blooms was adopted by the Church in the eighteenth century as a celebration of the flowering of Mary's maidenly spirituality... With its origins in Isaiah's prophecy of the Virgin birth of the Messiah under the figure of the Blossoming Rod or Root of Jesse, the flower symbolism of Mary was extended by the Church Fathers, and in the liturgy, by applying to her the flower figures of the Sapiential Books – Canticles, Wisdom, Proverbs and Sirach.



"In the medieval period, the rose was adopted as the flower symbol of the Virgin Birth, as expressed in Dante's phrase, 'The Rose wherein the Divine Word was made flesh,' and depicted in the central rose windows of the great gothic cathedrals—from which came the Christmas carol, 'Lo, How a Rose 'ere Blooming.' Also, in the medieval period, when monasteries were the centers of horticultural and agricultural knowledge, and with the spread of the Franciscan love of nature, the actual flowers themselves, of the fields, waysides and gardens, came to be seen as symbols of Mary..." – John S. Stokes

We, the members of Christ's Mystical Body, are the present-day disciples sent by the Holy Spirit to bring Christ to the world. May we go forth as did Mary, who set out in haste to assist St. Elizabeth (feast of the Visitation, May 31). Come upon us, O Holy Spirit, so that, with Mary, we may proclaim the greatness of the Lord who has done great things for us — for his mercy endures forever!

Mary, Mother of Grace, it becomes you to be mindful of us, as you stand near him who granted you all graces, for you are the Mother of God and our Queen.

Help us for the sake of the King, the Lord God and Master who was born of you.

For this reason, you are called full of grace. Remember us, most holy Virgin, and bestow on us gifts from the riches of your graces, Virgin full of graces.

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

April 30 – **Saint Marie of the Incarnation**, Ursuline, 1st superior of the Ursulines in Canada, missionary to the Natives and other residents, became proficient in local indigenous languages and wrote dictionaries and catechisms in Algonquin, Iroquois, Montagnais, Huron and Ouendat

April 30 – **Saint Pius V**, Dominican, Pope, implemented the reforms of the Council of Trent: new seminaries were opened; a new breviary, new missal, and new catechism were published; foundations were established to spread the Faith and preserve the doctrine of the Church, responsible for the tradition that popes wear white since he refused to remove his Dominican habit

May 1 – **Saint Peregrine Laziosi**, priest, patron against cancer and skin diseases

May 2 – **Saint Athanasius of Alexandria**, Archbishop, Doctor of the Church, Father of Orthodoxy, articulated the truths of Christianity at great cost, introduced monasticism (desert hermits) to the West, formulated the doctrine of homo-ousianism which says that Christ is the same substance as the Father, fought for acceptance of the Nicene Creed

May 3 – **Saints Philip and James, Apostles**

Saint Philip, originally a disciple of St John the Baptist, brought Nathanael to Christ
Saint James, the Lesser, cousin of Jesus, brother of Saint Jude Thaddeus.

May 4 – **Blessed Marie-Léonie Paradis**, Marianite Sister of the Congregation of the Holy Cross, founded the Poor Sisters of the Holy Family devoted to assisting priests and seminarians

May 6 – **Saint François-Xavier de Montmorency Laval**, Bishop, founded the Seminary of Quebec (now Laval University), Father of the Canadian Church, "Père de la Patrie", Patron of the Bishops of Canada

Sunday, May 1: **International Worker's Day (UN)**

Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker

A day to recognize the value of human work, defend the dignity of working people, encourage all to be responsible in their work, and celebrate the role that human work has in God's plan for creation. [CCCCB, ORDO]

Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth and to be productive in their labors (Gn 2:15). St. Joseph, the carpenter and foster father of Jesus, serves as an example of the holiness of human labor.

Tuesday, May 3 – **The Finding of the Holy Cross**

After the victory Constantine gained through the power of the Cross which he had seen in the heavens, Saint Helena, his mother, went to Jerusalem to try to find the true Cross. The Empress had the Roman statues and temples at Calvary and the Holy Sepulchre razed to the ground, and dug up. The laborers found nails and three crosses. The miraculous cure of a woman authenticated the sacred tree, to which we owe "life, salvation and resurrection". Saint Helena divided the precious wood in three. One part was deposited in Rome in the church of Holy Cross in Jerusalem; the second, in Constantinople; and the third in Jerusalem.

Commemorates the Mexican Army's victory over the French Empire in 1862
