The Beta prayer group which has regularly met on the second and fourth Fridays of the month, will be on hold until the Fall Alpha is over. It will recommence in December.

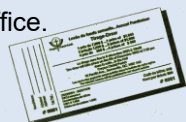

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

AUGUST is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

September is the month of the Sorrowful Mother

August 29 – The Passion of Saint-John the Baptist (the Beheading of St-John)

The Church, having celebrated the earthly birthday of Saint John the Baptist on June 24, today honors the anniversary of his martyrdom. Besides our Lord and our Lady, Saint John the Baptist is the only one whose birth and death are thus celebrated.

Tuesday, Sept. 1 – WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

Christians around the world celebrate the **beginning of the Season of Creation**, the month dedicated to prayer and action to protect our common home.

Sept. 3 – Saint Gregory the Great, (540-604; Rome), Benedictine, Pope, one of the four original Latin Doctors of the Church, champion of apostleship to England, collected melodies and plain chant such that they are now known as Gregorian Chants, wrote seminal works on the Mass and Divine Office; Patron of choir boys, educators, masons, music, musicians, choirs, singers, stonecutters, teachers, popes, students, scholars, against plague, gout and fever, England, West Indies

Sept. 4 – Blessed Dina Bélanger (Marie Sainte-Cécile-de-Rome), (1897-1929; Quebec), Religious of Jesus and Mary, musician, author, and mystic, the "Little Flower" of Canada

Sept. 5 – Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta, (1910-1997; Albania-India) Religious, missionary and teacher in Calcutta, India, founded the *Congregation of the Missionaries of Charity* in 1950, working with the poor & lepers and in disaster areas; Patron of World Youth Day

Monday, Sept. 7 – Labour Day, (Canada)

In Canada, Labour Day is a **special day of prayer for Human Rights and Equality** and for the Sanctification of Human Labour

Sept. 8 – The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mary's Birthday

Mary was born to be the mother of the Savior of the world, the spiritual mother of all men, and the holiest of God's creatures. Because of her Son's infinite merits, she was conceived and born immaculate and full of grace. Through her, Queen of heaven and of earth, all grace is given to men. Through her, by the will of the Trinity, the unbelieving receive the gift of faith; the afflicted are tendered the works of mercy; and the members of Christ grow in likeness of their Head. In Mary all human nature is exalted. We rejoice in her birthday, as the Church has done from the earliest times. This is one of the three birthdays in the Church Calendar, along with the birth of Jesus on December 25 and of John the Baptist on June 24.

On Our Lady's birthday the Church celebrates the first dawning of redemption with the appearance in the world of the Savior's mother, Mary. The Blessed Virgin occupies a unique place in the history of salvation, and she has the highest mission ever commended to any creature. We rejoice that the Mother of God is our Mother, too. Let us often call upon the Blessed Virgin as "Cause of our joy", one of the most beautiful titles in her litany. Since September 8 marks the end of summer and beginning of fall, this day has many thanksgiving celebrations and customs attached to it.

Sept. 9 – Saint Peter Claver, (1580-1654; Spain-Columbia) Jesuit Priest, known as "Slave of the Slaves", ministered to slaves, physically and spiritually, converting a reported 300,000, and working for humane treatment on the plantations, organized charitable societies among the Spanish; Patron of African missions, African-Americans, race relations, slaves, Colombia.

Sept. 10 – Saint Nicholas of Tolentino, (1245-1305; Tolentino, Italy), Augustinian, peacemaker, preacher, wonder-worker and healer, received visions, and visited prisoners. Had a great devotion to the recently dead, praying for the souls in Purgatory; Patron of: Holy Souls in Purgatory, animals, babies, boatmen, mariners and sailors, dying people

Sept. 12 – Most Holy Name of Mary

God the Father is glorified by the exalted role in salvation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Thus, her name is one of honour, a holy name, a maternal name and a name responsive to the needs of the church.
